

The Carl Junction City Council met in regular session on Tuesday October 5, 2010 at 7:00 PM at City Hall. Mayor Michael Moss called the meeting to order with the following present: Richard Zaccardelli, Don Marshall, Mark Powers, Steve Daniels, Dee Lynn Davey, Walter Hayes and Wayne Smith. Alderman Carl Skaggs was absent. Also present were City Administrator Steve Lawver, City Clerk Maribeth Matney and City Attorney Mike Talley.

AGENDA

Steve Lawver asked that we strike item 7 off of the agenda since we are going to have to hold another public hearing with P&Z since the Chapter submitted to them was incomplete. Mark Powers motioned to approve the agenda as amended. Richard Zaccardelli seconded. All in favor. No opposed. Richard Zaccardelli motioned to approve the consent agenda. Steve Daniels seconded. All in favor. No opposed.

PUBLIC FORUM

There was no one for public forum.

CHAMBER REPORT

Gary Stubblefield was not in attendance for a report.

DISCUSSION REGARDING ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 340.125 – GOLF CARTS OPERATING ON CITY STREETS

The council then discussed the drafts of a golf cart ordinance. There were 7 drafts put together. Mark Powers said he liked the last draft “C” that was received today. He checked and insurance on a golf cart would run about \$50/annually. Richard said he was told they need a title to insure a golf cart and they don’t have titles for them. After a lot of discussion it was agreed that it depends on the insurance company and their regulations. Chief Haase said that the only requirement he has is that it has lights after dark and proof of insurance. He feels very strongly that they carry proof of insurance with them. This ordinance would be city wide. There was some discussion about golf carts on state highways. Chief Haase also stated they had to be a licensed driver to be on our streets. Mike Talley said he could redo “C” to require them to carry proof of insurance. There was then a lot of discussion about liability requirements. It was stated that version “A” discusses liability and refers back to state statute regarding insurance and liability on vehicles. Chief Haase stated that ATV’s are not allowed on streets. It was also suggested it go through Code Review Committee. Dee Lynn stated that Chief Haase has to enforce it and that we should consider his recommendation. Chief Haase stated he liked version “A” since it seems to cover everything. There was a lot of discussion on this draft. After the discussion Dee Lynn Davey recommended that we put version “A” on the agenda for passage at our next regular council meeting. It was the consensus of the council to go with version “A”.

REPORTS

The council reviewed the Administration. There was nothing new to report.
Public Works report – there was nothing to add to the report.
Police Department report – there was nothing to add to the report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Nuisance Committee had nothing to report.
The Long Range Planning Committee will be meeting 10/25/10 at 7:00 PM.
The Budget/Finance Committee had nothing to report.
The Human Resource Committee had nothing to report.
The Public Facilities Committee had nothing to report.
The Code Review Committee had nothing to report.
The Senior Citizen Committee reported they had over 100 for their breakfast. The next one has not been scheduled yet.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mike Talley said he is still working on the Humane Society contract. Chief Haase asked if we could not start the new rates until our next fiscal year. They are also trying to cut back on how many animals they take to the kennel. Mike Talley said he would look into starting the rates in May instead of December. He will report back.

Walter Hayes asked about the sign by the water tower. He thought it was confusing. Steve said he used the MoDot signage for it. Steve also reported that he had a copy of the ED101 conference that they went to if anyone wants to look at it.

NEW BUSINESS

Mike Talley then reported that the county said that they could not collect the Briarbrook CID special assessment this year and they have asked the city to collect it. He is working with the county attorney trying to get some language to have a contract between the county and the city. The state statute is very specific that the county collect the special assessment, so if the city is to collect it there would need to be a contract. There are some issues and concerns that they are working though and Mike Talley will report back

to the council. There is a time constraint on this since we are about ready to send out our tax statements. There was some discussion amongst the council regarding the city collecting this assessment.

ADJOURNMENT

Steve Daniels motioned to adjourn the meeting. Dee Lynn Davey seconded. All in favor. No opposed. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 PM.
