

The Carl Junction City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, August 17, 2004 at 7:00 at City Hall. Mayor Jim Wisdom called the meeting to order with the following present: Richard Zaccardelli, Barbara Evans, Mike Moss, Gary Stover, Mike Palmer, Walter Hayes and Wayne Smith. Alderman Pat Smith was absent.

AGENDA

Barbara Evans motioned to approve the agenda. Richard Zaccardelli seconded. All in favor. No opposed. Wayne Smith motioned to approve the consent agenda. Walter Hayes seconded. All in favor. No opposed.

PUBLIC FORUM

Charlie Brown, 124 Hedge Drive, addressed the council about where we are at with the ditch along West Briarbrook Lane. Joe reported that our engineer has looked at it and had made a recommendation. We will need to go out for bid with a contractor to do the improvements. We will have to notify the owners on the amount of money needed. The entire ditch is on the property owners along West Briarbrook Lane. Mr. Brown reported that DNR was here after soil samples and water samples. They may be contacting the City. We plan on going out for bid in about 30 days.

FLUORIDE PRESENTATION

Mayor Wisdom stated that 3 doctors were here to present getting fluoride added to our water system. Tracy Godfrey stated that She moved back here 3 years ago to raise her family. She is part of Operation Smiles. 80% of families canvassed are in favor of adding fluoride to our water system. Their accrostic is SAFE: Safe, affordable, fair and effective. Some communities have been adding fluoride since the 1940's, it is naturally in the water and 1000's of studies have been done on it. It would be a small amount, 1 part per million. It is affordable and is a benefit from the very young to the very old. The national average cost per filling is \$83 and it cost \$1/per household/per year to add fluoride to the water, well below the cost of 1 filling.

Dr. Jack Udell, 104 Rocky Circle has been a resident of Carl Junction for 11 years. He is the Director of Pharmacy at St. Johns. He will cover the issues of Fair and Effective. The National Cancer Institute states that there is no evidence that fluoridation causes cancer. There have also been arguments that it causes Alzheimer's and birth defects but these have all been refuted. AMA states that there is no evidence and that 145 million people drink fluoridated water daily. He also stated that Freeman Hospital and St John's hospital are both in support of fluoridation. There were studies done in 1986 & 1987 and they have all been reviewed. Tooth decay has dropped 55% to 75% since fluoride has been added to water. It is a community benefit and does not discriminate on income. 80% of communities have fluoridated water in Missouri.

Mitchell Cross, attorney, 403 Birdie Circle, stated that his physician and dentist are both in support of adding fluoride to the water. He trusts their knowledge. They also both live in Carl Junction. He stated that it is an issue of public health. He stated we have the option to either put it on the ballot or pass an ordinance. He stated that we could put it on the ballot and they would only need to scare enough people for it to fail. It would be more effective as an ordinance. It is a public health concern. We have a representative form of government and they were elected to make these important decisions. The only local town that currently adds fluoride is Carthage. He has sample ordinance language if we need it. He is asking that the council take action on this issue.

Tony Moore, Jasper County Health Department, also stated that it was a public health issue. They did a study in 2002 on how to solve it and this was the solution they came up with.

Dr. Jeff Knutzen, 125 Foursome Lane, stated he has been a pediatric dentist for the past 15 years in the 4 states. He is only 1 of 2 dentists in a 50-mile radius of Joplin and they are overwhelmed. He is 1 of 4 that takes Medicaid children. He stated that the argument is that it is the parent's responsibility to take care of their children's teeth. He stated that they are uneducated. This is an opportunity to take a step forward for the children in our community.

Richard Zaccardelli stated that he came from Cleveland Ohio where they have fluoridated since the 1950's and his children did not have any cavities while living there.

Mike Palmer appreciated all the people who showed up to support this issue. He agreed it would be a great thing for the children. He asked who did the survey that showed that 80% of Carl Junction residents supported this issue. Tony Moore said that it was done in 2002 for Jasper County. They sent out 1500 surveys' and got responses from 25%. 100 of them were residents from Carl Junction and 82% supported the fluoride issue. Mike Palmer said that the issue is whether we put it on the ballot or pass an ordinance. Richard Zaccardelli motioned to have our attorney prepare an ordinance to add fluoride to our water system. Barbara Evans seconded. Gary Stover stated that we are elected to represent the citizens of Carl Junction but he feels that it should be a ballot issue since it is such a controversial issue. If there is such a majority it should pass with no problem. Mike Palmer is in favor preparing an ordinance for the next meeting and we can hear from the opponents at that time. If no one comes to object we can pass the ordinance without going to the ballot. Walter Hayes asked about the cost of the election to put it on the ballot. Gary replied that we are having an election in April anyway and it would not cost that much. Mayor Wisdom asked about equipment costs. It is similar to adding chlorine we would need to see what would all be required. It was stated that it would cost approximately \$2500 a well to add the equipment at each well head. It was also stated that the Community Health Coalition is trying to help offset the capital costs if we decide to add it. Mike Palmer asked if it takes a special license to handle it. It was replied it is similar to our chlorine tanks and the licensing is the same for it. Mo DNR engineering staff has agreed to come down and help the communities. There was discussion about dead end lines also. Our next meeting is 9/7/04. 5 (Zaccardelli, Evans, Palmer, Hayes, W Smith) in favor of the motion on the floor. 2 (Moss, Stover) opposed. 1 (P Smith) absent. Gary Stover then motioned to put it on the April ballot. Mike Moss seconded. Gary said he made this motion because he thought this was just a presentation and was not expecting the council to take action. 2 (Stover, Moss) in favor. 5 (Zaccardelli, Evans, Palmer, Hayes, W Smith) opposed. 1 (P Smith) absent. Motion failed.

APPOINTMENT OF POLICE OFFICER

Chief Hofer introduced Matthew Moore. He is POST Certified and has 3 years experience. Mayor Wisdom stated he would like to appoint Matthew Moore as a new police officer for Carl Junction. Mike Palmer motioned to approve the Mayor's appointment of Matthew Moore to our Police Department as a police officer. Walter Hayes seconded. All in favor. No opposed.

ORDINANCE ANNEXING 136 ACRES

This ordinance annexes property owned by Redwood Development that is North & East of the High School. Mike Palmer motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING APPROXIMATELY 130.43 ACRES IN THE NORTHWEST AND 6.48 ACRES IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 6, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 33 WEST IN THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, JASPER COUNTY, MISSOURI, LYING GENERALLY NORTH AND EAST OF THE CARL JUNCTION HIGH SCHOOL, AND OWNED BY REDWOOD DEVELOPMENT INC AND CARL JUNCTION ESTATES LP, AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN THE BODY OF THIS ORDINANCE" on first reading by title only. Walter Hayes seconded. Mike Palmer motioned to put it on second reading by title only with a rollcall vote. Walter Hayes seconded. Zaccardelli-y, Evans-y, Moss-y, Stover-y, P Smith-absent, Palmer-y, Hayes-y, W Smith-y. Motion on Ordinance #04-52 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

P&Z CASES

Mayor Wisdom opened the public hearing on Case #04-24 – Rezoning from UD to R-1 – Redwood Development at 7:50 PM. Rick Schroeder, 3609 E 20th, Joplin addressed the council. This is the land involved with Deerfield Estates that has 60 lots that is N & E of Katlin Subdivisions. P&Z recommended approval. There was no one in the audience for or against it. Public Hearing closed 7:53. Mayor Wisdom opened the public hearing on Case #04-25 – Rezoning from UD to C-2 – Redwood Development at 7:55 PM. Rick Schroeder stated that this land runs along Hwy Z and is about 300' deep. The land west of Hartley is not included in this because they thought it had already been zoned commercial. P&Z recommended approval. There was no one in the audience for or against it. Public hearing closed 8:00 PM. Mike Palmer motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, MISSOURI, BY ORDINANCE NO. 99-10 ON THE 18TH DAY OF MAY, 1999, AS AMENDED, TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 6.48 ACRES IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 6, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 33 WEST IN THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, JASPER COUNTY, MISSOURI, LYING GENERALLY NORTH AND EAST OF THE CARL JUNCTION HIGH SCHOOL, AND OWNED BY REDWOOD DEVELOPMENT INC AND CARL JUNCTION ESTATES LP, AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN THE BODY OF THIS ORDINANCE, FROM UD TO C-2" on first reading by title only. Motion on Ordinance #04-54 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

Case #04-27 – Preliminary Plat of Deerfield Estates #1. This consists of 60 lots that are North and East of the Katlin #1 & #2 plats. P&Z recommended approval. The set backs were changed to 25' and they are requesting a 50' cul-de-sac not 60'. That would be consistent with stormwater Phase II. Kurt has recommended this but it is not reflected in our code. There was discussion about exceptions on subdivisions. This has been discussed in the past but has not been acted on. It was stated that we need to advertise and hold public hearings on it. Walter Hayes stated he would like to see our code reflect this change. P&Z recommended approval with conditions. Walter Hayes motioned to approve the preliminary plat as presented contingent upon an ordinance changing our code to 50'. Mike Moss seconded. All in favor. No opposed.

Zaccardelli-y, Evans-y, Moss-y, Stover-y, P Smith-absent, Palmer-y, Hayes-y, W Smith-y. Motion on Ordinance #04-58 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

Joe explained that the contract with HOUSE Inc was revised to reflect 10 families and not 6. They think that is too high and they will be checking with Joplin about connecting to their line. Richard Zaccardelli motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A REVISED AGREEMENT FOR SANITARY SEWER SERVICE BY AND BETWEEN HOUSE, INC., THE VILLAGE OF AIRPORT DRIVE, MISSOURI, AND THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, MISSOURI, TO PROVIDE FOR THE TRANSPORTATION AND TREATMENT OF SEWAGE FROM HOUSE, INC., COMMENCING AUGUST 17, 2004; PROVIDING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREOF; AND, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, MISSOURI" on first reading by title only. Motion on Ordinance #04-59 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

Mike Talley explained that currently when a building is declared dangerous they hold a hearing in front of the Board of Alderman and if they want to appeal that decision they appeal it to the Board of Aldermen. This ordinance transfers the authority to the Building Board of Appeals that is part of our BOCA code. They hold the hearing and make the determination. If it is appealed it goes to the Circuit Court for that appeal. It takes the Board of Aldermen out of the process and eliminates the public pressure. Gary Stover motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE V. BUILDING CODE: CHAPTER 525: EXISTING STRUCTURES, ARTICLE II. DANGEROUS BUILDINGS, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 525.080, 525.090, 525.100, 525.130 AND 525.170 TO PROVIDE THAT THE BUILDING BOARD OF APPEALS SHALL HEAR COMPLAINTS FILED BY THE BUILDING INSPECTOR PURSUANT TO ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 525, AND THAT THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN SHALL NO LONGER HEAR SUCH APPEALS" on first reading by title only. Mike Moss seconded. Barbara Evans motioned to put it on second reading by title only with a rollcall vote. Richard Zaccardelli seconded. Motion on Ordinance #04-60 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

Gary Stover stated that he would like to see the City do a more comprehensive study on the City's needs and not just a bridge. Some of those needs are they need a bridge from Briarbrook to Hwy 171, widen Briarbrook Drive, widen Fir Road and connect Joplin St to Copper Oaks. He knows that we are not responsible for all of these roads and he knows that there are needs in the other parts of the City. Mayor Wisdom stated that is all true but this grant money can only be used for trails and trafficway's. This is not street and highway money. His biggest concern is the water line to connect our two systems. It has been a problem in the past. We can get grant money to help us run that water line. Walter Hayes agreed with Gary that we need a comprehensive study also. He suggested Gary make a motion that a study be done. Walter Hayes then motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A LETTER AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, MISSOURI AND COOK, FLATT & STROBEL, ENGINEERS, P.A., TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ENGINEERING SERVICES TO THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION TO UPDATE THE 1999 EXPRESSWAY/TRAILWAY FACILITY STUDY CONNECTING CARL JUNCTION AND BRIARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB FOR THE SUM OF \$1,750.00; PROVIDING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREOF, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION, MISSOURI" on first reading by title only. Richard Zaccardelli seconded. Walter Hayes motioned to put it on second reading by title only with a rollcall vote.

Richard Zaccardelli seconded. Zaccardelli-y, Evans-y, Moss-n, Stover-n, P Smith-absent, Palmer-y, Hayes-y, W Smith-y. Motion on Ordinance #04-61 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction. There was more discussion about doing a comprehensive study on our needs and streets.

It was stated that we left our language the same on bottle rockets and took out the business district statement. Wayne Smith motioned to put "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE II. PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE: CHAPTER 210: OFFENSES, ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES, BY AMENDING SECTION 210.760: FIREWORKS, TO PROHIBIT THE DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF CARL JUNCTION EXCEPT ANNUALLY ON JULY 1 THROUGH JULY 5, INCLUSIVE, FROM 9:00 A.M. TO 12:00 A.M. (i.e., MIDNIGHT)" on first reading by title only. Barbara Evans seconded. Wayne Smith motioned to put it on second reading by title only with a rollcall vote. Walter Hayes seconded. Zaccardelli-y, Evans-y, Moss-y, Stover-y, P Smith-absent, Palmer-y, Hayes-y, W Smith-y. Motion on Ordinance #04-62 was approved by rollcall vote, signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and made a part of the permanent records of the City of Carl Junction.

REPORTS

The council read the City's Administrator's report. He stated that we are still having problems with our SCADA system. Mike Palmer offered some assistance with that.

Memo #1 – Pending items. It was asked about 203 N Broadway. Joe reported it wasn't as bad as it was made out to be and has been fixed. The contractor was not totally responsible for all of it but he fixed it. Fast Freedom has looked at the tower and Joe is awaiting the contract back.

Memo #2 – Entrance Sign. The council looked at the samples. They recommended that we use the logo on our website. It will cost \$4500 and the lights will be inside the sign. It will be heavy duty to withstand the vibrations from the RR tracks. Joe has not heard back from the RR on the cost. He thinks we will need to do it and send them the bill. There was some discussion about the lights and being able to replace them ourselves or getting lights that do not need to be replaced very often. Colors were also discussed. It was the general consensus to use black and red.

Memo #3 – Safety manual. Joe reported it was on file for review.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Human Resource Committee reported they will meet at 6:00 PM on 9/7/04. They will be discussing Chapter 125 and the safety manual.

Nuisance Committee reported that Mike Talley will be drafting ordinances on weeds and junk autos.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Joe received a bid on repairing the entrance lights at Cambridge and Arlington. It will be \$2850. It does not include the road cut or meter at the pole. We pay the electricity on these lights. Mike Palmer will look into this. It might be Empire's responsibility to some extent. Joe also reported that the bathrooms at Memorial Park are 99% done. We have ADA ramps, parking, wheelchair access and will be landscaping for drainage. There is a pole at Memorial Park that has 3 old meter boxes on it that is leaning. Joe would like to replace the pole and put 1 new meter box on it. That cost is \$5100. He would like to pursue this. Mike Palmer will check that pole out it might be a meter pole.

Joe also reported that we sent out 9 letters to residents about hooking onto our sewer lines. If they do not hook up by 9/7/04 we will go out for bids and hook them up and put a special tax lien on the property. These includes the houses along Gum Road.

Mike Talley reported that the statutes Rick Rogers supplied to him were on the transportation of dogs and not his issue. He thinks he has explained it to Mr. Rogers to his satisfaction. He does have a dog charge pending in the municipal court but he will not get involved in that. He also reported that there has been no progress on the Special Road District tax issue. He has been talking to the Carthage Attorney.

NEW BUSINESS

Gary stated that if we do a study on our traffic needs it will add credibility when we approach these other entities for assistance. He is not sure of the cost of doing the study. Joe stated he has talked to the Road District about Fir Road and Briarbrook Drive. Joe reported that we can get sales tax for a traffic improvement district when we start getting some more economic development. Richard Zaccardelli also stated that Steve Lawver said there might be money to put a sidewalk down Briarbrook Drive. Walter Hayes suggested we put a traffic study in next year's budget. We may have to do a G.O. Bond for the improvements. There was more discussion of the issue. Mike Palmer suggested talking to a firm and getting a ballpark figure for the study.

Wayne Smith stated he would not be here for the next meeting.
